This award is presented annually for an outstanding book on some aspect of the history of the U.S. federal government, by the Society for History in the Federal Government. Aldona Sendzikas is an Associate Professor in the Department of History, and teaches the second-year course Advanced American Studies. Congratulations on this achievement!

#### **Don Abelson's Recent Scholarly Activities**

The Second Edition of Donald Abelson's book, *Do Think Tanks Matter? Assessing the Impact of Public Policy Institutes* (McGill-Queen's University Press, 2009) has been translated into Simplified Chinese by the Shanghai Academy of Social Sciences (SASS). The SASS is the largest and most prestigious think tank in China.

#### DON ABELSON APPOINTED DIRECTOR OF THE CANADA-U.S.INSTITUTE: March 25, 2010

Dr. Julie McMullin, Acting Dean, Faculty of Social Science announced that Professor Donald Abelson will be the inaugural Director of the Canada-U.S. Institute for an initial three-year term. Donald Abelson is a Professor and Chair, Department of Political Science, and Director, Centre for American Studies at UWO, who specializes in the study of American politics and foreign policy.
