The Centre for American Studies is delighted to welcome special guest, Professor of Social Policy, Law, and Women's Studies at Brandeis University, [Anita Hill](#). Anita Hill is the author of numerous articles on international commercial law, bankruptcy, and civil rights. She has written her biography, *Speaking Truth to Power*, and was the co-editor with Professor Emma Coleman Jordan of *Race, Gender and Power in America: The Legacy of the Hill-Thomas Hearings*. Her latest book is *Reimagining Equality: Stories of Gender, Race, and Finding Home*. Anita Hill has given numerous presentations on commercial law as well as race and gender equality. She has appeared on several television programs, such as Face the Nation and Meet the Press, and her commentary has been published by *Newsweek*, the *New York Times*, and the *Boston Globe*.
